Workshop on Alignment and Integration for competency based undergraduate medical curriculum by Dr Krishna G Seshadri, NMC Expert, Visiting Professor, Dept of Endocrinology, Diabetes and Medical Education, Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth University, Puducherry on 14th August 2021. The mode of workshop was online on Zoom platform. The workshop was organised by Dept of Medical Education, KMC, Manipal. A total of 45 participants attended the workshop. The participants were either Heads of departments or CBME coordinators of UG teaching departments.

After initial open house where the challenges faced by departments for implementing CBME was addressed, five break out rooms were created. In small groups, the participants were requested to discuss on pros and cons of integrated teaching, their experience of implementing integration and challenges faced by individual departments.

Key learning from the workshop

- The curriculum governance has to be strong within any institute for effective CBME implementation
- MEU has to play only a facilitatory role guiding departments
- The approaches for integration has to be policy of the institution
- More student driven activities to be devised as this is a student driven curriculum









































Points discussed:

• Open House:

- Preparation of linker cases How to link subjects, phases.. A workshop in the future offline session
- Medicine Too many certifiable competencies less manpower many competencies maybe learnt by the students themselves as adults – can also use manpower from other depts. –no need of specialists to teach several things in medicine
- Training happening in Tertiary hospitals being slowly shifted to taluk hospitals
- Feedback regarding CBME Negative and positive obtained. Too early to intervene
- Need for CBME Lacunae in Communication, Previous system was imparting Knowledge very well
- The CBME moves the responsibility of the learning, log book maintenance and clearing exams to the student
- What drives curricular change? Domain Docks
- Governance issues to be addressed
 - Curriculum committee should be in charge of curricular changes
 - MEU should only facilitate
