

Training Program in Corporate Finance

The Department of Humanities and Management, MIT, Manipal conducted a three-week Executive Development Program (EDP) on Corporate Finance for the executives of Mozambique Ports and Railways from 11-28 March 2024. These executives each had work experience ranging two decades. This program was custom-designed for Certified Financial Managers (CFM) to meet their requirements. The EDP covered various topics on Corporate Finance and focused on Financial Statement and Analysis, Capital Budgeting, and Investment Management. EDPs such as this enhance the quality of education and economic growth beyond borders.
